John wrote a short report about some of the wonderful things that happened during his remaining time in India after the team left. It is so encouraging...

We conducted a few medical camps after the team left. They went very well. One was in Debbalapalem Village, by our land near the ocean. This is the same community that we distributed the tsunami relief to when it first hit. It has been our desire to start a church in this village. These people have been slaves to the idols for many generations. They are scared to worship any other but those idols. Pastor Isaac faithfully has been visiting the village for two years now. He says there are some secret believers there but they do not want to come out yet. He has gotten a chance to witness to them and the people are opening up their hearts to the Lord. They only want to meet him in their homes not in public.

Another medical camp we conducted was in the village where we had one in the school with the team. Many of the elderly folks from the village couldn't come so we went back and did checkups and distributed the meds house to house. It was great. It was just me, one Doctor, some local leaders and two of our Pastors, and we weren't in any rush. We took time to be with them. We started at 10am and went until 6pm. There were only 80 adults and lots of children. The Doc was great. He was also enjoying the peaceful atmosphere and genuinely caring for the people. We got to drink lots of coconut water that day because the people were grateful for the attention and care!

We did another medical camp at the central prison. We were going to do a camp before but the superintendent did not approve the permission. Later when Pastor Bhaskar Rao visited some inmates he reminded him of the camp. The next day the warden wanted us to come with meds and distribute them through their doctor. We could be there for only an hour and a half because it interrupts their chores around the prison. Though there are hundreds of prisoners we only had permission for one area that had 30 prisoners. We were glad we went. They know now we love and care for them in Jesus name. We gave out Gospels and said if any one wants a Bible we will give them one. Many wanted one, praise God!

Then I was happy to receive the materials we had ordered for the Pastors' tool kits. We received three PA systems and stands for mics, the drums, and dolaks (tribal drums for that area) and more gas lights and 10 First Aid kits with the reference book Where There Is No Doctor and other helps. We were happy to distribute them to those who were waiting for them. They were so happy and blessed to receive them.

It was great to be at Jeeva Jalem again. They were grateful for the help and comfort we gave to them thanking God for each one of us because we made them feel they are important.

The water purifier is working now. We figured out that the missing part was given for recharging and was not picked up. We distributed another round of rice and grocery supplies. Pastor Jacob and Laxman Rao are working with the government agency there to see if there is any grant in aid that will be available from a local congressman to rebuild their broken homes. I told them as the Lord provides we will partner with the project and actually come and build the homes. It seems the congressman needed that assurance from us. Please pray.

We are also praying to help Pastor Thomas up in the mountains near the Orrisa border. The church, which was built after our previous trip, was burned down. Please pray how we can encourage those believers. Pastor Thomas and the few believers do not seem to be worried what might happen next. They are ready to rebuild the church. They gained a lot of sympathy from leaders in the area. They've been watching how these Christians will react. Please keep them in prayer.

There are so many things that I pray for the Pastors and their call and vision. We have witnessed how God is using them in these villages. They are the shining light in those dark villages and making the difference in the community, lifting up the name of Jesus above all.

Especially during Easter time all the churches are having fasting prayer nights. There are so many exciting things happening there. God is great. I just want to thank you for your part each year in the ministry and your faithful prayers and support. I wish more people could understand

more and would pray then more hearts would be moved and more souls are added to the kingdom. Thank you for all. I look forward to sit with you and pray about many things
